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	A fall from a horse due to actions or poor control by the rider	Riders perform self-paced on horses matched to their ability. Team managers are responsible for ensuring same. Marshalls and chief Steward monitor throughout the day Ref: Information Procedure Section 1	Marshalls and Chief Steward will restrict any participant from competing when a safety concern is identified. Participants are not permitted to ride without the "Gear Check, Horse Rider Combination Suitability and Horse Health Confirmation" sign off sheet being completed by the Team Manager and official gear checker. Ref: Information Procedure Section 1	Team Managers, Authorised Pony club personnel, Horse Sport team	Prior to activity/ies
	An uncontrolled action by a horse (e.g. kicking, biting, striking or pulling back.)	Known kickers stay a reasonable distance from other horses whilst in marshalling area. Parents in this situation are required to stay with the horse. Red ribbon placed on offending horse. Riders responsible for warning others of potential biting or striking behaviour. Ref: Information Procedure Section 2	Horse behaviour will be monitored throughout the event. Monitor changes over day (e.g. weather) that might impact on the behaviour of horses. If a horse shows dangerous or aberrant behaviour Marshalls and Chief Steward will restrict the horse from competing if uncontrolled actions cannot be safely managed. Ref: Information Procedure Section 2 and Section 4	Team Managers, Authorised Pony club personnel, Horse Sport team, Riders	Prior and during the event

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	A fall by horse and rider due to adverse conditions. e.g. poor arena preparation, slippery surface.	Pre-event arena inspections carried out. Check ground surface is free from obstruction and set hard barriers if problem areas are found. Subsequent inspection/s made as required but particularly prior to the day of the event. Activity marshalls monitor surface conditions during conduct of activity. Chief Steward responsible for overall arena monitoring. Ref: Information Procedure Sections 3 and 4	An assessment will be made on the day to ensure conditions are suitable for each event to proceed. Marshall to complete events checklist "Safety Procedure to Assess and Approve Activity/ies to Proceed and Confirmation of Assessment and Findings" before the commencement of each event. Ref: Procedure Information Section 4 Monitor changes over the day through random inspections and spot checks. Competition will be halted, postponed or cancelled if bad weather or poor arena surface conditions cause safety concerns.	Team Managers, Authorised Pony club personnel, Horse Sport team, Riders	Prior to activity/ies during the event
	A fall from a horse due to an unpredictable incident. Interaction between a horse and / or rider with a third party.	No dogs allowed onsite. Pedestrian and vehicle movement restricted areas enforced. Roped off areas and appropriate signage placed around grounds. Horses ridden only in areas identified for that purpose. Ref: Information Procedure section 3	Rope off areas for horse movement, rope off spectator only areas, appropriate signage placed around grounds. Ensure horse free pedestrian paths to toilets, canteen and car park. Competition halted if concerns arise, resuming only when risks can be adequately controlled.	Principal, Horse Sport Team	Prior to event
	A fall from a horse or other accident due to inadequate gear. (e.g. tack failing, footwear failing to release rider).	Pre-event gear checks carried out by Team Managers and Official Gear Checkers using "Gear Check, Horse Rider Combination Suitability and Horse Health Combination" form. Participants are not permitted to ride without the Gear Check being completed.	Parents/horse owners will have signed the entry form confirming the rider/horse combination suitability, prior to acceptance of rider's entry forms. le. Riders are experienced horse riders, and the horse/rider combination for the event is suitable to the riders ability. Team Managers are responsible to undertake the Gear	Team Managers, official gear checkers, riders	Prior to participating in activity/ies

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		This check will be supervised by Chief Steward Any gear changes during the day will likewise be checked and monitored. Ref: Information Procedure section 1	Check, whilst undertaking the Gear Check, Team Managers will complete the Gear Check, Horse Rider Combination Suitability and Horse Health Confirmation form. Team Managers are to discuss with the parent/horse owner: • the suitability of the horse and rider combination, and • check that the horse is fit for the purpose and free of illness or injury. Team managers provide the rider with a saddle tag for gear check sticker to go on. If concerned the Team Manager alerts the official gear checker of concern and documents on the form prior to handing to the official gear checker. Official gear check conducted by Pony Club personnel straight after the Team manager where another sticker will be provided following a successful completion of the gear check. Gear Check Appeals/Disputes Gear Check appeals/disputes will be dealt with (if required) by Chief Gear Steward and Blandford Public School Horse Sports Management Team. Final decisions regarding Gear Check appeals/disputes will be the responsibility of the Host Principal and Blandford Public School Horse Sports Management Team. Riders who fail to observe this rule will be disqualified.
