# What is a Poetry Slam?

A Poetry Slam is a competition where people recite poems without props, costumes, or music. It puts a dual emphasis on the written word and performance, encouraging poets/performers to focus on what they're saying and how they're saying it.

The poem can be an original or one from another author.

# What style of poem can be performed?

One of the best things about poetry slam is the range of poets/performers it attracts. Poets/performers are free to do work in any style, on any subject.

### What are the rules?

Blandford PS Poetry Slam rules are:

- · Poems can be an original or from another author. Your job is to engage your audience!
- Start your performance with the title and author of the poem.
- Props, costumes or musical instruments are NOT to be used.
- Each poet/performer should aim to recite their poem within the allocated time.
- Points will be deducted from performers if there is a difference of 30 seconds or more from the allocated time:

Kindergarton	Year 1/2	Year 3/4	Year 5/6
1 minute	2 minutes 30 seconds	4 minutes	5 minutes

- Audience members must give their full attention to the poet/performer while they are performing.
- Audience members are encourgaged to respond to the poet/performer in an appropriate mannner. Remember, it takes a lot of courage to stand up and perform in front of an audience!
- The judges' scores will be totaled, and a grand slam score given. The poet/performer with the greatest total in each stage is the winner and will be awarded a certificate and special prize.

# Parent's Guide to Accelerated Reader

# What is Renaissance Accelerated Reader (AR)?

AR is a reading program that helps teachers support and monitor children's reading practice. Your child picks a book at their own level and reads it at their own pace. When finished, your child takes a short online guiz to measure how much of the book they understood.

# What is a Renaissance Star Reading test?

Star Reading is an online test used to measure your child's reading level. The test uses multiple-choice questions and takes around 20 minutes.



#### How do students select books?

AR includes over 40,000 books. These can be found in the school library as well as public libraries, books shops, homes, etc. Each book is assigned three scores to help your child make a suitable choice:

#### **Book Level**

Book Levels represent the difficulty of the text. The Star Reading test tells your child what range of Book Levels to read within. This is called the Zone of Proximal Development (ZPD).

#### **Points**


Books are assigned Points based on their word count. Points are earned by passing quizzes. Students are set personalised targets each term by their teacher.

#### Interest Level

The Interest Level indicates for which age group a book is suitable for. It does this based on the content and themes.

Interest Level	Age (in years)
LY - Lower Years	5-8
MY - Middle Years	9-13
MY+ - Middle Years+	12+
UY - Upper Years	14+





The two examples above both have a Book Level of 4.6. This is because they both have short sentences and simple vocabulary. However "A Dog's Journey" is worth 13 points because it's a lengthier text and is intended for Upper Years' students. Meanwhile "Little Miss Sunshine and The Wicked Witch" is worth 0.5 points as it is much shorter and intended for Lower Years.

## How can I help my child become a better reader?

- Make time for them to read at home. Children need to read for at least 20 minutes every day to improve their reading ability.
- Encourage your child to read; discuss books, asking questions about what they have read; and visit
  your local library.
- Find suitable books for your child at <a href="www.arbookfind.com.au">www.arbookfind.com.au</a>. Use the search function to look for specific titles or topics, or go to Advanced Search to browse for books within your child's ZPD and interest level.
- To find out more about your child's reading progress, visit Home Connect. This will allow you to track your child's progress towards their targets and to view your child's reading history. Contact the school to find out more information.




